#### Remembering Joe Ford


Hello Friends.

### 9 winter preparation tips



**We New Englanders** know that we have no control over the winter weather, but with a little preparation, we can make the winter season easier to manage. Here are nine tips.

- 1. Get annual maintenance on your home heating system.
- 2. Check and clean your chimney every year.
- **3.** Confirm your gas appliances are **properly vented.**
- **4.** Install **battery-operated** smoke, carbon monoxide and gas detectors.
- **5.** Test existing detectors and replace batteries.
- **6. Remove any debris** around your fuel storage tank, fill pipe, heating unit and power venter.
- 7. Trim tree branches away from your roof.
- **8. Prepare for snow removal**. Replace broken shovels, tune-up the snowblower or confirm your spot with your snow removal company.
- **9.** Keep your **cell phone charged,** especially if a storm is in the forecast.

# Update on dialing changes

**The Federal Communications Commission,** through Order FCC 20-100, required that seven-digit local dialing would transition to 10-digit dialing

in NH, VT and parts of NY, beginning April 24th, 2021.

Beginning October 24, 2021, consumers with the area

codes **603**, **607**, **516**, **716**, **845**, **914** and **802** now must dial ten digits. Calls with only seven digits may not be completed as dialed.

Consequently, consumers who have any of the following devices or services will have to reprogram them to dial the required ten digits:

- ✓ fire or security alarms
- ✓ mobile contact lists
- ✓ fax machines
- ✓ life safety systems or medical monitoring devices
- ✓ call forwarding or voice mails

For New Hampshire, 911 emergency services are not affected. The National Suicide Prevention hotline will remain 1-800-273-8255. However, beginning July 16, 2022, you can also dial 988 to call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline.

- After a severe storm, carefully check your property for downed power lines, damaged gas lines or damage to your propane tank and appliances. Contact us to report any problems.
- Make sure your outdoor vents remain clear of debris so that combustion gases don't back up into your home
